

What is the difference between the ® symbol and the ™ symbol?

The ® symbol should be used only AFTER the mark is federally registered with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (PTO). Until then, a business might use the ™ symbol next to its mark, but should not use the ® symbol. The ™ symbol may help support a claim to "common law" trademark rights, but does not convey the statutory rights that come with a federal registration under the Lanham Act. To obtain such a registration, an application must be filed with the PTO, which will examine the application to determine if the mark satisfies various requirements (a process that often takes twelve to eighteen months).
